

My goal with this guide is to assist the average home theater junkie with a fast-track to putting the Pronto into high-level service. To eventually store all of those OEM remotes away and have one really good remote to control everything. Hopefully, when you are finished, your spouse may even like using it. In my book, that is THE ultimate home theater remote.

I have designed this guide to be easy to follow, with three “tracks”. With the “track” concept, you can jump in wherever you are comfortable. For example, users of other Pronto models could likely start their journey in Track Two. The Guide is segmented into three tracks:

**Track One:** If you are new to the Pronto, then I recommend you start here. You will create a very simple “practice” configuration, using all of the basic activities. Once you have completed that session, you can begin to work on your first “real” configuration. Please take the time to go through the practice session. It will help you learn, understand and reinforce the basics, which you will continue to use into the future.

**Track Two:** We discuss the three basic design configurations; Basic, Enhanced Basic and Activity-Based and which might be better for you. You will be introduced to our Design Methodology and the design aides, to begin putting your configuration on paper. You will learn the benefits of Macros and understand the different types of IR Codes.


**Track Three:** You will learn some of the more advanced concepts such to take your configuration to the Next-Level, such as; creating custom buttons, adding custom graphics, released-state versus pressed-state buttons, more about Activity-based configurations, IR codes, third-party tools and much more..

Track One - for the New Pronto owner or new to Pronto NG.


Track Two - for the graduating 1st time Pronto owner or intermediate user.

Track Three - for those who wish to take it to the ultimate level.

## Pronto NG / Earlier Models - Organization

Because there are now many models of the Pronto (TSU1000, 2000, 3000, 6000, 7000, various RAV models, European RU models, etc), I felt it was important to try and support as many as possible, within a single guide. While this guide is written primarily for the TSU3000 (Pronto NG) and the TSU7000 (ProntoPro NG) and their European counterparts, there is a LOT of information in this guide which can help owners of earlier Pronto models. So, I have devised an icon system which identifies if specific information is usable on earlier models. As you go through this guide, you will see icons in the left margin, similar to those in the table at the left. If you see the  symbol, it means the information pertains to the NG, The Pro NG, as well as earlier models. If the **NG** symbol is listed, it typically means a feature that is exclusive to PENG or the Pronto NG hardware. Likewise if you see a **PP** symbol, than this function is only available in the ProntoPro NG.
